

#### 1. WHAT IS THE GRAPHIC DESIGN PORTFOLIO REVIEW?

It is a closed door evaluation of your artwork after completion of the following classes in the Department of Art BFA Program (or their transferred equivalent): Design I & II, Drawing I & II, 3D Design and Intro to Computing Art. (Students who are currently enrolled in 3D Design and/or Intro to Computing Art are eligible to apply.)

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#### 11. WHEN WILL I KNOW THE RESULTS OF THE REVIEW?

The review is con dential. The Art O ce will contact you via MSU email as soon as the results are available. Please make an appointment with your Art Advisor if you have questions about your results.

## 12. WHAT STEPS DO I TAKE AFTER "ACCEPTANCE" OR "DENIAL" FROM THE REVIEW?

The review will result in an "acceptance" or "denial" into the Graphic Design program.

#### IF ACCEPTED

The student may begin the Graphic Design concentration sequence of courses.

Register for ART 2813 Intermediate Computing Art in the Spring. This required course is only o ered in the Spring and is only open to students who have passed the GD Portfolio Review.

ART 2813 Intermediate Computing Art is essential in bridging the gap between Intro to Computing Art and Graphic Design. It is the pre-requisite for Graphic Designdd Typography — the entry-level graphic design core classes that are only o ered in the Fall.

Attend the Graphic Design: New Student Orientation Meeting in the Spring. Details will be announced early in the Spring semester.

#### IF DENIED

The student may remain in the art program and resubmit a portfolio in the next Graphic Design Portfolio Review o ered the following year. (It occurs once per year — every Fall semester.)

Students are encouraged to re-work their portfolio before reapplying.

Students are allowed to apply twice. If a student is denied the second time, they are not allowed to apply again and must pursue a di erent

photo tips.

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#### FORMATTING FOR DIGITAL PRESENTATION

#### FILE NAMING

Portfolio pieces must be recorded and formatted for digital presentation anonymity, students should name each le like so. and review.

etc.) will need to be scanned or photographed at high resolution. Digital
designs (e.g., Illustrator and Photoshop les) will need to be saved or

- \*\*The portfolio images should not have borders. Images (scans and photographs) should be cropped to remove the background.


#### SERIES FORMATTING
